Our roots at Partners in Prime are in the senior center movement. Although we have focused on people 55 and older since our beginnings, we are now taking on the challenge of working with a fully broadened age group at our West Chester Activity Center.

A recent survey of senior center participants provided a list of many positive benefits that are achieved. Participants reported they exercise more regularly, laugh more, have reduced stress, feel more energetic, worry less about the future, and are generally more satisfied with life.

Another of our major programs involves senior nutrition... we serve nutritionally balanced lunches at multiple sites, deliver more than 500 Meals on Wheels most weekdays, and we help distribute monthly food commodity boxes to eligible seniors. The nationwide purposes of these programs are to decrease hunger and food insecurity; promote socialization; and to promote health and well-being via a more balanced diet. Even so, senior hunger abounds, and there are older people in our area who make the Solomon's choice getting their medicines or getting food. During March, we will be involved in the March for Meals promotional efforts coordinated by Meals on Wheels Association of America, of which we are members.

I am proud of the many roles that Partners in Prime plays to improve life in our community. Looking back at our overall results for 2011, we achieved in multiple areas, and we're enclosing our brief Annual Report along with this newsletter issue.

Yet, there remains much more to do, and an ever-growing population of older adults to serve. Of course, the struggle is for us to have the resources to adequately do our job. We appreciate our funders, our donors and our members. 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Assistance Available for Winter Heating Bills

HEAP is designed to help eligible low-income Ohioans meet the high cost of home heating. If you are eligible, the amount of your one-time HEAP benefit will depend on federal funding levels, how many people live with you, total household income, and the primary fuel you use to heat your home. In most cases, the one-time benefit will be a credit applied to your energy bill by your utility company (or fuel vendor). Applications are available at all prime clubs. Don't Be A Victim

The Butler County Commission has declared March Butler County Crimes Against the Elderly Month, and Partners in Prime is on board to help older adults to avoid becoming victims of scams.

Prosecutor Michael Gmoser has formed the Crimes Against the Elderly Task Force to target and prosecute those who prey on the elderly as well as to educate the public. Representatives include law enforcement banking and insurance agencies, as well as agencies that represent those 65 and older. Partners in Prime's Steve Schnabl was asked to join, as well as representatives from the Middletown Area Senior Center and Oxford Seniors, LifeSpan, Council on Aging and the Butler County Elderly Services Program.

Call the “Scam Hotline” at 1-888-662-3673 if you suspect you have been contacted by someone trying to scam or you have fallen victim to a scam. Authorities will be alerted to investigate the matter. People also may read about reported scams at www.countyprosecutor.org.

Scam Alert

Never give out your social security number to someone who calls you. If you receive an e-mail claiming to be from the IRS and asking for personal information, do not reply or open any attachments or links. The IRS does not initiate taxpayer communications through email, and never asks for detailed personal or financial information.

Also, do not let strangers into your house. There is a ploy in Indiana where people are claiming to sell air fresheners, and while inside, they case the home for robbery.

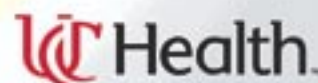

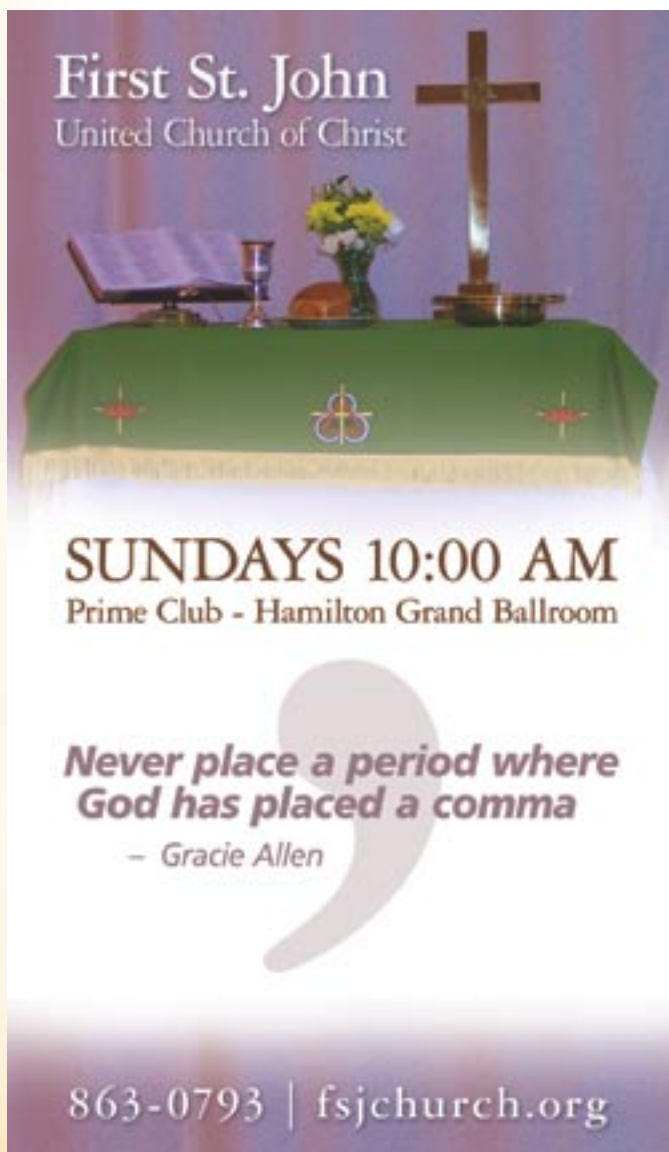
by virtue of courage and compassion for the well-being of others and the community.
